


Past inherited as culture – Mostly unspoken assumptions about what constitutes truth beauty and goodness that we inherit from our upbringing.




Past interpreted – Past measured for its significance.




Wisdom

- Date: 14th century
- 1: the communication or reception of knowledge or intelligence
 2 a (1): knowledge obtained from investigation, study, or instruction (2): Intelligence, news (3): facts, data

Knowledge

Main Entry: knowl - edge 2 a (1): the fact or condition of knowing something with familiarity gained through experience or association. (2): the range of one's information or understanding c: the circumstance or condition of apprehending truth or fact through reasoning. 4 a: the sum of what is known: the body of truth, information, and principles acquired by humankind

Wisdom

- wis dom

- 3. wise sayings or teachings; precepts.

Chronology

- Main Entry: chro-nol-o-gy
- Date: 1585
- 1 : the science that deals with measuring time by regular divisions and that assigns to events their proper dates
 - 3: an arrangement (as of events) in order of occurrence < reconstruct the chronology of the trip>
