 - Fear that Totalitarianism would spread to the west.



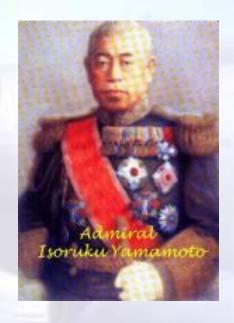


- Why were France and Great Britain becoming nervous of Germany in the 1930's during this rise of totalitarianism?

 - The German annexation of Austria alarmed France but did not shake Great Britain's policy of appeasement.

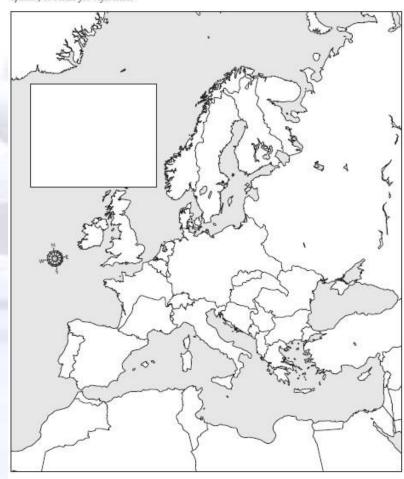

Outcomes

- The Nazis killed between five and six million <u>Jews</u> and nine to ten million non-Jews.
- Stalin is responsible for 20 million deaths
- World War II reached almost every area of the world, and mobilization for war brought widespread suffering and even starvation.
- The war caused 20 million civilian deaths.

- After the war, ideological conflict between the West and the Soviet Union resulted in the Cold War.
